FAR ROCKAWAY MAN STABBED TO DEATH IN LAST REPORTED MURDER OF 2018

A 21-year-old man was stabbed to death outside a Far Rockaway McDonald's on New Year's Eve. It was the last reported murder in 2018. Devonte Brandon, of Falcon Avenue, was found with multiple stab wounds to the chest around 9:30 p.m. on Monday, police said. A veteran firefighter was arrested on Sunday for leaving the scene of an accident that caused the death of man in Westchester County, police said. Eric A. Ex-Counselor Sues Employer For Discrimination In Federal Court

An ex-employee of a Long Island substance abuse rehab facility is suing his former employer for disability discrimination — a year after the facility settled an age discrimination suit with another ex-employee.

Nicholas Elgar, a Certified Alcohol and Substance Abuse Counselor-trainee (CASAC-T), filed a lawsuit against Seafield Center Inc. in Brooklyn Federal Court in January 2018 accusing Seafield of violating the Americans with Disabilities Act of 1990.

Elgar. who is diagnosed with Attention Deficit Disorder, was allegedly demoted, denied overtime pay and confronted with "unequal terms and conditions" of employment, according to court documents. He was ultimately fired.

Elgar named Seafield Outpatient Executive Director Lynn Doris as a defendant in the suit.

Despite a record-low number of traffic deaths in 2018, New York City streets remain a dangerous place for pedestrians and cyclists — a bleak reality highlighted by the reported deaths of two pedestrians and a cyclist on New Year's Eve and New Year's Day.

Though vehicle occupant and cyclist deaths reached record lows in 2018, pedestrian deaths did not decrease at the same rate, which safety advocates attribute to infrastructure flaws and persistent problems with the city's driving culture.
