The Second Department Appellate Division has hit the restart button on a 2001 depraved indifference murder conviction and sent the case back to a Queens grand jury．

In February 2001，a jury found Thomas Hernandez，then 21，guilty of murder for his role in a 1999 group attack that killed a teenager in Rego Park．Hernandez and three adolescents kicked，punched and beat 16 －year－old Thomas Lee with a baseball bat．

Lee died as a result of blunt force trauma to the head，injuries consistent with being hit seven times with a baseball bat．

Hernandez，a Briarwood native，appealed his conviction in 2004，but it was upheld by the Second Department．His lawyers appealed again after Justice Richard Buchter denied a 2016 motion to retry the case based on a new precedent set by the Court of Appeals，which changes the depraved indifference statute．

The case People v．Payne changed the definition of＂depraved indifference murder＂ to mean that＂absent unusual circumstance， a one－on－one shooting or knifing（or similar killing）can almost never qualify as depraved indifference murder，＂according to the Second

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Department's decision released on Wednesday. This time around, the Second Department judges focused on the highest court's precedent, which was set forth just 15 days before their decision to uphold Hernandez's conviction was finalized.
"Although the new law on depraved indifference murder does not apply retroactively to convictions that became final prior to the change here, the defendant's conviction did not become final until after People v. Payne was decided," the Second Department determined.

A spokeswoman for Hernandez's attorney Jonathan Edelstein told the Eagle that the lawfirm Edelstein and Grossman were considering the next steps in the case.
"We are pleased with the decision and we will discuss next steps with the client," the spokeswoman said.

A spokeswoman for Queens District Attorney Richard A. Brown said the office "intends to seek leave challenging the decision."

During the 2001 trial, Hernandez's original
co-defendants Jason Figueroa, then 14; Boris Kunin, then 15 ; and Besnick Prebreza, then 17, all testified against him. Figueroa was charged with manslaughter while Kunin and Prebreza were charged as youthful offenders and received six-month sentences.
"Turning to the merits of the motion, the trial evidence was not legally sufficient to support a verdict of guilt of depraved indifference murder," the court wrote in a unanimous decision. "Accordingly, the Supreme Court should have granted the defendant's motion [to] vacate so much of the judgment of conviction as convicted him of depraved indifference murder, and dismissed that count of the indictment."

Hernandez was charged with intentional murder, depraved indifference murder, three counts of fourth-degree criminal possession of a weapon and first- and second-degree manslaughter before Justice Richard Buchter

The jury acquitted Hernandez of intentional murder, but convicted him of depraved indifference murder and one count of possession of a weapon in 2001.

A manspreading teenager was charged by cops on Wednesday for allegedly punching another straphanger who asked him to close his legs.

As a 59-year-old man sat on a Manhattanbound M train on Oct. 31, Joseph Chamorro boarded at the Northern Boulevard station and sat next to the older rider.

Chamorro, 18, "made incidental physical contact" with the straphanger, police said.

When the man asked the Ridgewood teen to move his legs, he was punched in the face. The assault was so vicious, it caused the man to suffer a cut to his nose and his glasses to break, police said.

Before Chamorro got off the train at the Queens Plaza station, the injured rider snapped a picture of his assailant, who smiled, according to the photograph released by the police.

Chamorro received a desk appearance ticket for the assault charge and is expected to be arraigned on Jan. 14, a spokeswoman for the Queens District Attorney's Office said.

The victim refused medical attention.

Police are asking for the public's help identifying suspects involved in the death of a 58 -year-old St. Albans man during an attempted home invasion.

As Mario Cesar entered his 116th Avenue home on June 28, a man approached and pushed him to the ground. During the 9:30 a.m. attack, Cesar was stabbed multiple times in the face and torso, police said.

The suspect was seen on surveillance video before the murder creeping in the back of a neighbor's home before attacking Cesar. The knifeman was captured on video fleeing on foot and entering a silver Chevrolet Impala, police said.

Cesar, 58, was taken to Franklin General Hospital where he was pronounced dead.

The alleged stabber is described as an African-American man, who was last seen wearing black and white gloves, a purple bucket hat, a black hooded coat, purple pants and darkcolored shoes.

There is no description for the driver of the getaway car, police said.

## State Senate Newcomers Endorse Congestion Pricing

Congestion pricing gained momentum this week as six incoming members of the New York State Senate went on record as strongly supporting the proposal.
Democrat Brooklyn Sens.-elect Andrew Gounardes (Bay Ridge-Southwest Brooklyn), Zellnor Myrie (Crown Heights-parts of Park Slope-Sunset Park) and Julia Salazar (Bushwickparts of Williamsburg) were among a group of six that issued a joint statement on Wednesday calling for congestion pricing legislation.
"We support a comprehensive, robust, fair and sustainable funding plan for the MTA that includes congestion pricing at its core. Congestion pricing has the unique potential of raising over a billion dollars each year dedicated to transit. Without it we will not achieve the revenue necessary to achieve those goals," the statement reads in part.

Congestion pricing, which would require state approval, involves charging motorists a toll to drive into Manhattan. The funds that are generated by the toll would be used to fix the city's beleaguered transit system.
Gov. Andrew Cuomo supports congestion pricing, and the concept has been gaining traction since last month, when Democrats won the majority of seats in the state Senate that will begin its new session in January.
In their joint statement, the six new senators called on legislative leaders to make congestion pricing a top priority.

In addition to Gounardes, Myrie and Salazar, the statement was signed by Sens.-elect Alessandra Biaggi (Bronx-Westchester), Robert Jackson (Washington Heights-Inwood) and Jessica Ramos (Jackson Heights-Corona).
The vast majority of the city's residents will not feel a financial pinch in having to pay the tolls, according to the soon-to-be senators. "Drivers who commute into Manhattan represent a small, comparatively wealthy portion of

the public," they wrote
John Raskin, executive director of the transit advocacy group the Riders Alliance, said it was important that the new members of the Senate are raising their voices on an important transportation issue.

## NYC Deputy Mayor for Housing, Economic Development to Depart



A deputy mayor who helped secure New York's Amazon deal and has overseen the city's troubled public housing system will leave the administration. Officials say Deputy Mayor for Housing and Economic Development Alicia Glen will depart within a few months. The New York Times reports Glen, who was appointed in Democratic Mayor Bill de Blasio's first term, had a key role in the deal that includes nearly $\$ 3$ billion in incentives for Amazon's secondary headquarters in New York. A replacement for the former Goldman Sachs executive has not been named. - The Associated Press
"This statement matters because it's momentum for congestion pricing, from a group of newly elected progressive senators, who ran on a platform of fixing the broken subway system and who see why fixing the subway is a social justice issue. The subway has long symbolized Albany's failure, but with the governor's commitment to congestion pricing and new urgency in the Legislature, we can finally raise the billions of dollars we need to turn transit around," Raskin said in a statement.

But not everyone is on board with the idea.
Queens Assemblymember David Weprin (D-Fresh Meadows-Richmond Hill) appeared at a press conference in Long Island City last week with City Councilmembers Barry Grodenchik (D-Douglaston-Floral Park) and Daneek Miller (Cambria Heights-Hollis-Jamaica) to denounce congestion pricing.
In a statement, Weprin raised concerns that a congestion tax would raise the cost of "doing business," asserting that such a tax would raise the cost of consumer goods, limit competitive ability of local small businesses and "impose a monetary
barrier to Manhattan for outer-borough residents." But Gounardes said his decision to support congestion pricing was prompted in part by deteriorating service on bus and subway lines in his senate district.
"Our public transit system is in deep crisis. Compared to the only 3.6 percent of commuters in our district who drive into Manhattan regularly, tens of thousands of commuters in our district are being left behind by a failing transit system with little hope of improvement," he told the Brooklyn Eagle via email.

Gounardes talked about the need for congestion pricing while he was campaigning for the Senate seat.
"Throughout my campaign, I expressed support for congestion pricing as a way to help fund the critical investments our public transit system needs, so long as the funds are dedicated solely to transit improvements and we simultaneously work to lower the tolls on outer-borough bridges, including the outrageous toll on the Verrazzano-Narrows Bridge," he said.

Gounardes said he will also push for a rider representative to have a seat on the MTA board.

## New York State Unemployment Rate Hits Record Low

New York state's seasonally adjusted unemployment rate has fallen to its lowest level since the current system of record-keeping began in 1976.
The new numbers, released yesterday by state labor officials, show New York's jobless rate fell to 3.9 percent in November, down from 4 percent the month before.
The number of unemployed New Yorkers fell to slightly more than 379,000 last month,
the lowest level since 1988.
Job gains were greatest in the educational and health services industries, followed by leisure and hospitality. Publishing and telecommunications and manufacturing sectors posted declines.
Of the state's metropolitan areas, Ithaca saw the greatest job gains.
The state's unemployment rate is still slightly above the national average in November of 3.7 percent.

## How to Handle the Return of a Long-Lost Family Member During the Holidays

Humans are social animals who crave connection with others. It's a drive that seems hard-wired into our systems so that when we experience rejection or estrangement from others, the experience can feel much like physical pain.
The desire to avoid these painful feelings may be why many people go out of their way to reconnect with wayward family members during the holidays, even if this reconnection risks discomfort, hurt feelings or disappointment. This does not mean that we should avoid welcoming home family members but suggests it does mean that a dose of realistic expectations, with some proven techniques, can make for more peaceful holiday visits with estranged family members.
As a clinical psychologist and researcher who studies couples and families with chronic health problems, I often hear from people who feel like they are the only ones who have family relationships that have gone awry. Yet, they have more company than they realize, and there are strategies to cope.

## An Undesirable Distance

Many people experience tense family relationships from time to time. Estrangement is a more prolonged condition that consists of physical or emotional distancing from one or more family members that is not mutually desired. Family estrangement is relatively common, with 4 to 10 percent of adults reporting distancing behaviors between adult children and their parents.
The numbers are likely to be higher when examining other family relationships, such as sibling relationships and when considering the large numbers of families that are affected by problems that may contribute to estrangement. For instance, alcohol and drug addiction, a common trigger of estrangement, affects the lives not only of the person with the addiction but also of 100 million adult family members globally.

In addition to addictions, parents with estranged adult children also blame estrangement on problems such as chronic lying and problematic relationships with people outside the family.

## Estrangement Can Go Both Ways

Yet, it is not always the behavior of children that contribute to estrangement. Adult children report actively distancing themselves from parents they perceive as judgmental, narcissistic or abusive. Thus, estrangement can serve a protective function, allowing affected people the emotional space to care for themselves and decide how to navigate their relationships.
While distancing oneself from a family member may be a healthy strategy for some people, it can also contribute to feelings of loss, distress and stigmatization. Why is this the case? One explanation is that many people deem family ties as permanent ties, worthy of respect and care. Expressions like "blood is thicker than water" and "charity begins at home" symbolize the importance of family ties and the need to protect them at all costs. These strong cultural messages can contribute to feelings of guilt and attempts to reconcile, especially when friends and relatives push reconciliation, a strategy that is not recommended unless both parties wish to do so.
As shown in addictions research, family members can benefit when they nonjudgmentally explore the pros and cons of different types of engagement with their loved ones. For instance, they can take a zero-tolerance approach, such as barring the loved one from the house, remain silent in the face of problematic behavior, or distance themselves from the loved one. Finding people on whom to rely for support can also provide relief to families who are considering welcoming home estranged family members.

## Building Bridges and Gingerbread Houses

But what other strategies can be used by loved ones when welcoming a family member with whom they share a troubled relationship? Much of the advice for handling stress around the holidays is fitting in this situation. In addition, there are several strategies based on psychological therapies that may be useful:

## Be Honest and Realistic with Yourself

What is it that you want to achieve by reconnecting with estranged family members over the holidays? Are you looking for a brief, nonthreatening together time, the first steps to rebuild a relationship? Based on your prior interactions with your family members and reflecting on why the estrangement happened, how likely is it that this will happen? Might you need to change your expectations? Or are there certain things you can do to add structure and reduce the likeli-

hood of greater distancing? For instance, if you are concerned about sensitive topics that might trigger angry and hurt feelings, perhaps build in an activity, a project such as making a gingerbread house together or playing games to take the focus away from past hurts or rehashing negative events. If alcohol use or abuse has contributed to the estrangement, consider serving a variety of non-alcoholic beverages instead.

## Develop the Capacity to Tolerate Distress

When we avoid how we feel because it is painful, we may sometimes act in ways that may drive others further away. Distress tolerance is essential to counteract the likelihood of hurtful exchanges. One way of building the capacity to tolerate distress is mindful awareness practices including meditation, short breathing exercises, or mindful and intentional focus on activities like walking and listening to music. These activities can build up distress tolerance prior to gathering with family members but also during family gatherings. For instance, one could retreat to the kitchen to mindfully chop vegetables or wash the dishes or excuse oneself to take a brief walk.

## Pay Attention to Your Loved Ones

Mindful awareness can also be directed to family members. In my own research and clinical practice with couples coping with challenging health problems, emotional distancing often happens when family members do not accept their loved ones' painful emotions as valid or real. Emotional validating responses such as asking questions about how a loved one is feeling and reflecting back the feeling or experience - phrases such as "That sounds tough," or "I am sorry that you're feeling this way" - express care and concern and are related to better personal and relationship well-being. Emotional validation is not the same as agreeing with their choices or why they feel the way they do. Therapies to improve emotional validation are promising
treatments for couples and families experiencing emotional distance, though they remain to be tested in cases of estrangement.

Practice Gratitude and, If Possible, Forgive
Whether it is possible to welcome back family members or be welcomed back yourself, it is still possible to express gratitude for those people who bring you joy or have helped you learn something important. Acts of gratitude are associated with well-being and may help focus on the positive aspects of difficult relationships. When that s not possible, appreciate the goodness in life rather than focus on relationships gone wrong. Perhaps the most difficult of all is forgiving those from whom we feel alienated. Forgiveness can heal the pain associated with memories of betrayal and difficult relationships and promote well-being. Yet, no one should feel shame or beat themselves up for not being able to forgive.

Start New Traditions
It may not be possible to salvage family relationships; perhaps, it is just too risky to engage with an estranged family member. In these cases, consider starting new traditions to celebrate the holidays, and find the social connection you desire. Celebrate at home with friends, have personal retreat time, or take a trip. It is not necessary to wait for the holidays to start new traditions. The Family Dinner Project has resources for creating mealtime rituals to create and sustain mealtime rituals to promote healthier bodies and relationships.
The holidays, a generally optimistic time, may be just the right time to reconnect with family members with whom we are distant. It is also a time to take care of ourselves, experience joy and recharge for the year ahead. It is possible to do both with planning and preparation.

and current chairman, told the Eagle. "They had sections they opened up in the 1800s that they called 'public sections,' and people bought these graves for next to nothing. They didn't have the money for perpetual care," he said.

All Faiths
Metropolitan Avene spans Mt. Olivet Crescent on its west side to 69th Street on its east side. The cemetery's public section is located in its southwest corner, according to Austin, whose grandparents are buried there.
"There's no money in those areas," he added.

Many of the deceased individuals in the cemetery were once poor. Plots were sold at low prices so that they were affordable to people with limited means, a mission of the cemetery's founder, Rev. Dr. Frederick William Geissenhainer.

Geissenhainer was able to take advantage of the Rural Cemetery Act of 1847, which permitted nonprofit organizations to build cemeteries on rural land; this property would then be considered tax exempt. Then, known as Lutheran Cemetery, it was eventually developed as a non-denominational burial ground.

Current law adds to the challenge of renovating the cemetery's sunken and toppled gravestones, Austin said. Funds paid for perpetual care on some grave sites cannot be used to maintain grave sites that haven't paid. To do otherwise would be committing a misdemeanor, he said.
"It's not like the U.S. government. I can't use your money and my money to take care of something that's not our responsibility," said Austin. "The cemetery cant use the PC [perpetual care] fund money to straighten out these graves."

Austin also noted that

families who could afford perpetual care decades ago might not have been able to keep up with the rising costs of labor maintenance or neglected to respond to deficit letters sent by the cemetery.
"When a grave is in deficit, all we can do is cut the grass," Austin said.

Despite its renovation needs, the cemetery's future isn't at all gloomy: a student program at Christ the King Regional High School, located across the street from All Faiths, occasionally helps maintain the cemetery, and District 30 Councilmember Robert Holden has also spoken in support of the cemetery's upkeep.
"Cemeteries are historic sites that are important to the character of any neighborhood, and I would be happy to see any efforts made to preserve the rich history of All Faiths," Holden told the Eagle.

The Eagle confirmed with an NYPD spokeswoman that as of press time, no reports of criminal mischief were reported at All Faiths during December 2018.

All Faiths is not the only Queens cemetery to struggle with disrepair. The Eagle reported earlier this year on the state of the Bayside Jewish Cemetery, located in Ozone Park. That cemetery has rotted and crumbled due to a decadeslong mix of neglect, theft and vandalism.
Rabbi Joseph Potasnik, executive vice president of the New York Board of Rabbis, told the Eagle that the cemetery's decline, "should be a concern to all people because it's about respect for the dead. We talk about respect for the living but respect for the dead is equally important and we need to correct it."

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## Stephen Colbert: Trump Spoof Book ‘Whose Boat’ Wrote Itself

For Stephen Colbert and his "Late Show" staff, the best-selling spoof "Whose Boat Is This Boat?" essentially wrote itself.
Because all of the words are by President Donald Trump, who is billed as the author "by accident." The picture book's title and contents were inspired by Trump's disjointed response last September to Hurricane Florence, which struck North Carolina and South Carolina, where Colbert grew up.
"If you love Trump, you'll love this book because every word in it is exactly what he said," Colbert, for whom the president has been prime comic material, said during a recent interview with The Associated Press. "And if you're antiTrump you'll love this book because every word in it is exactly what he said."
"Whose Boat Is This Boat? Comments That Don't Help in the Aftermath of a Hurricane" has sold hundreds of thousands of copies and raised more than $\$ 1.25$ million for such charities as Foundation for the Carolinas and World Central Kitchen. The contributions come from author proceeds and from the publisher, Simon \& Schuster.
Books can take years from conception to publication, but "Whose Boat Is This Boat?" was essentially written in 24 hours and within six weeks was already on shelves, physical and virtual. It began after Trump visited New Bern, North Carolina, and was preoccupied with a yacht that had landed in a resident's backyard.
"To see what we're seeing - this boat. I don't know what happened, but this boat just came here," he said. Other comments included "At least you got a nice boat out of the deal" and "Have a good time!"
"Late Show" staff writer Emmy Blotnick heard Trump's remarks and said, "That sounds like a children's book."

With illustrations by Audro Buneta and John Henry, "Whose Boat Is This Boat?" looks like a bedtime story, albeit one that ends with the message "There is no moral." Defining it has proved challenging: On The New York Times best-seller charts, it appears under "Advice, How-to \& Miscellaneous."
"We should be on the nonfiction list," Colbert said. "I smell a rat."

According to a Times spokesperson, "The book was placed on the advice, how-to and miscellaneous list where many books that defy easy categorization have ranked. It's a great achievement being on this highly competitive list for six weeks, including a week at No. 1, and we wish Stephen were happier about it."
Colbert said the book is for "children of all ages," one that appeals to kids because it's "pretty to look at, no nudity, no violence" and one that shows adults how "our president responds" to natural disasters. The book is billed as "an excellent teaching tool" that lets readers learn "about empathy by process of elimination."
"Whose Boat Is This Boat?" isn't the first picture story to mock the Trump administration. "Last Week Tonight with John Oliver Presents a Day in the Life of Marlon Bundo" is a best-selling parody of "Marlon Bundo's Day in the Life of a Vice President," a tribute to the family's pet bunny written by Mike Pence's daughter, Charlotte Pence, and illustrated by his wife, Karen Pence. The vice president is known for his conservative social views; in Oliver's book, Marlon Bundo has fallen for a fellow male bunny.

Charlotte Pence herself bought a copy of the Oliver edition, noting that proceeds went to charity. Colbert senses he may have similar luck with Trump and his family.
"What I'm hearing, from the voices inside my head, is that he enjoys it," Colbert said, mimicking the president's own fact-checking style. "Everybody is saying he likes it."

## Katherine Johnson, at Age 100, Is Telling Her Life Story

Retired NASA mathematician Katherine Johnson, who turned 100 last summer, has waited long enough to tell her own story.

Johnson's "Reaching for the Moon" is an autobiography for middle graders that will be published next fall, Atheneum Books for Young Readers announced yesterday. Johnson was one of the pioneering black women featured in the book and film "Hidden Fig-
ures," in which she was played by Taraji P. Henson. Johnson and such colleagues as Dorothy Vaughan were vital in helping NASA successfully launch flights into space, and eventually to the moon, in the 1960s.

Johnson said in a statement that she wanted young people to believe they could do anything, no matter their race or gender. "I knew who I was and what I was capable of," she said.

By Paula Katinas Queens Daily Eagle Transit advocates are expressing concern that the de Blasio administration isn't doing enough to let the public know about the reduced MetroCard program known as Fair Fares that is coming in January and are calling on the mayor to use his bully pulpit to get the word out.
The Riders Alliance is one of 38 signatories on a Dec. 12 letter to Mayor Bill de Blasio that demands that he release a detailed plan on how his administration intends to let low-income New Yorkers know that starting in January, they will be able to purchase MetroCards to ride the city's buses and subways at half price.

An exact date for the launch of Fair Fares has not been announced.
The Fair Fares program is costing the city approximately $\$ 100$ million, yet few people know about it, advocates said. And those who are aware of the program are still waiting to
learn the details of how they can go about purchasing half-fare MetroCards according to the Riders Alliance.
Nearly 800,000 New Yorkers, including tens of thousands of Brooklyn residents, will be able to take part in the Fair Fares program, according to most estimates.
"As January 2019 fast approaches, all the lowincome New Yorkers we promised to help are eagerly waiting to learn how they will be able to sign up for and start benefiting from their reduced-fare MetroCard. Among them are: the working poor, especially immigrants who do not qualify for public benefits or are fearful of accepting federal programs that might put themselves or family members at risk; the unemployed searching for work; and low-income college students struggling o get the education they need to get ahead," the letter reads in part.

Some details about the program's launch have already been made public. For example, in order to get the reduced price, riders
will have to purchase sevenday unlimited or 30 -day unlimited MetroCards.
The Community Service Society (CSS) helped launch an effort back in 2016 to convince the city to sponsor a Fair Fares program. That same year, CSS released a study that found one in four low-income New Yorkers could not afford subway and bus fares.

The lack of affordable transportation options stymies economic growth,
since people could not afford to take jobs outside of their neighborhoods, the CSS study found.

In June of this year, the mayor and City Council Speaker Corey Johnson announced that the Fair Fares program would be included in the city budget.
"We have to make New York City a city that works for all 8.6 million New Yorkers, because at the end of the day, fairness will determine our future," de

Blasio said in a statement issued at the time the announcement was made. Jaclyn Rothenberg, a spokesperson for the mayor, told the Brooklyn Eagle that the de Blasio administration is preparing to inform the public about the reduced MetroCard program.

One disappointment about D.C. is the gossip that masquerades as 'reporting.' This story has: - Not a SINGLE named or verifiable source - Only ONE on-therecord comment, which is a denial," Ocasio-Cortez wrote on Twitter on Tuesday after the article appeared on Politico's website and tongues started wagging in the Capitol.

And in case anyone didn't get her point, Ocasio-Cortez added to her tweet. "My dad had a name for junk articles like this: ‘Birdcage lining,’" she wrote.
A spokesman for Jeffries told the Eagle Wednesday morning that the congressmember would have no comment on reports that Ocasio-Cortez is gunning for him. But the spokesperson also pointed out, in an email to the Eagle, that OcasioCortez had declared the Politico story to be untrue. Meanwhile, Politico isn'

backing down.
Brad Dayspring, vice president of marketing and communications for Politico, told Fox News that the political news website stands by its reporting.
"It's hard to know what the criticism of the piece is since the congresswomanelect doesn't specify (nor has she or anyone from her staff asked for a correction). We stand by our story," Dayspring told Fox News.
Politico reported on Tuesday that Ocasio-Cortez and a group of progressives called Justice Democrats are planning to go after Jeffries in 2020 and that a candidate
has been recruited to run against him.
Jeffries, whose congressional district includes Coney Island, Canarsie and East New York in Brooklyn and Howard Beach and South Ozone Park in Queens, was elected to serve as chairman of the House Democratic Caucus. Ocasio-Cortez rocked New York's political establishment when she toppled longtime incumbent U.S. Rep. Joe Crowley in June's Democratic primary in a district that covers several Queens neighborhoods and a portion of the Bronx. She subsequently won election in November.

A 33-year-old Jamaica man admitted to shooting a 22 -year-old man to death outside of a baby shower last month, police said.

Lhosni Colot faces up to 25 years to life in prison for the second-degree murder of Tymel West on Nov. 3 outside of a home on 107th Avenue near Guy R. Brewer Boulevard.

Colot, 33, and West, 22, got into an argument before shots were fired, police said.

Prior to the shooting, Colot was seen on video surveillance at a bodega with two others - not involved with the murder. Colot, who was arrested on Monday, admitted that he shot West using a firearm, according to the criminal complaint.

West was shot multiple times in the chest taken to Jamaica Hospital Medical Center where he was pronounced dead.

This was not Colot's first brush with the law. He was arrested on Jan. 2 for breaking a woman's cell phone, a heater and drinking glasses inside her home on 231st Street, according to court documents. Colot received an adjournment of contemplation of dismissal agreement by a Queens judge and was

ordered to stay out of trouble for a year. The new charges are a violation of the terms of
the agreement for the fourthdegree criminal mischief charges.

A veteran educator was arrested earlier this week for taunting a student while using a piece of foil from a medication package to scratch the teen's face.
Around 10 a.m. on Dec. 7, Paul S. Ray held "a sharp object" to a 16-year-old boy's face and asked him "if (the student) was afraid?" inside Richmond Hill High School, according to the criminal complaint.
Ray, 59, then slashed the teen's face "approximately three times" with the foil, according to the court document.
The teacher, who has been employed with the

Department of Education (DOE) since 1998 as a substitute and became a fulltime teacher at Richmond Hill High School in 2000, was arrested on Tuesday.
Ray has no prior disciplinary history.
"We've reassigned this teacher pending the criminal investigation of this deeply troubling allegation," said Doug Cohen, a spokesman with the DOE.
Judge David Kirschner released Ray on his own recognizance after he was arraigned for a slew of charges including seconddegree assault and fourthdegree criminal possession of a weapon.
If convicted, Ray faces up to seven years in prison.

Amazon is a trillion－dollar company and is controlled by the wealthiest man on the planet；yet it consistently mistreats and dehumanizes its workers around the globe－the very women and men who have made the company successful．

Amazon workers in Germany，Italy and Spain have gone on strike and we＇ve seen massive demonstrations by Amazon workers in Great Britain over the way they are being mistreated．

Amazon＇s business model is based on receiving taxpayer subsidies，paying little or no taxes and mistreating their employees．
Amazon warehouse
workers face outrageous work workers face outrageous work quotas and cruel working conditions that have left many people with illnesses and injuries．Contracted workers， such as those making＂last mile＂deliveries，have described inhumane working conditions and demands． These couriers say they cannot take bathroom breaks and often feel compelled to drive dangerously to satisfy the stringent demands of Amazon．

In the United Kingdom alone，there have been 600 ambulance calls to the online retailer＇s warehouses in the past three years，and，according to a study by the GMB union， roughly 80 percent of workers experience pain on the job．

The importance of Amazon and what it means for the future world of work transcends one company．
